

Impact of Digital Media in English Language Teaching to the Engineering Students

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Abstract

According to the writer, Forums and blogs have helped to improve English writing skills. The result of the research by the writer proves that YouTube, Facebook and WhatsApp and Wiki have ranked as the top most influencing social media rendering help in learning English language in Hong Kong (Joyce, 2017).

“Social Media and Its Effects on Individuals and Social Systems,” is also a research article which points out that the social media has an influence on human brain that in turn forms the quality of life and behaviour. The emoticons make human communication easy. However social media also has adverse effect on human behaviour and his learning. Sensible social media interaction is needed for the effective communication in the society

which is also vital for learning English language without major complications (Natascha, 2014).

“Explore the Ways of Using of Social Media Platforms in Teaching English Language,” is explored by Norah Hussein, brings out the idea that technology has provided the platform for facilitating the process of learning and teaching English language. The writer has recommended web blogging and Wiki text as the major social tool for developing writing skills. Blogs can be made as the virtual writing sharing platform for the users to post themes of various subjects and get comments and participate in live discussion ((Natascha, 2014)).

Blogs and Writing Skills

Wikipedia defines blog as a discussion or informational website published on the World Wide Web consisting of discrete, often informal diary-style text entries. Posts are typically displayed in reverse chronological order, so that the most recent post appears first, at the top of the web page. Oxford dictionary defines Blog as a regularly updated website or web page, typically one run by an individual or small group that is written in an informal or conversational style. It is also known as weblog which is known as online journal or informative website displaying information in the reverse chronological order, with latest posts appearing first. It is a platform where a writer or even a group of writers share their views on specific subject.

Blogs create communicative environment to share information and experience of the teachers that in turn will motivate the learners to share what they know (Norah). English teachers can create an account in any blogging service and publish a class blog where the students should be provided access to read and make comments. The students can also post any content related to class and clarify doubts. The teachers also use the blog to get feedback and evaluate students' academic writing assignments. Learning is a continuous process for which regular practice is mandatory. “The language learning is a systematic process, where the learning has to be practised continuously without crack”(Balamurugan K, 2019)

Wikipedia defines Wiki-books as a wiki-based Wikimedia project introduced by the Wikimedia Foundation for the creation of free content e-book textbooks and glossed texts that anyone can read and edit. Teachers can use wiki as a guide document for the students to refer and update. Teachers and students can enter into discussion in the wiki forum. Both of them can write article to be published in Wiki regularly and get feedback about them. The students can be encouraged to post stories in wiki to improve creative writing skills.

Facebook and Twitter

Social Media benefits writing skills. When someone writes with spelling or grammar mistakes, the readers can easily point out the mistakes and the writer becomes aware of his own spelling or grammar errors at once. It is estimated that 750 million people on earth are using

Facebook and 190 million tweet every day. Facebook has the potentiality to facilitate interaction, collaboration, communication and discussion among students and teachers. Writing in Facebook and Twitter is more malleable than writing. It provides social space for the individualised experience through online (Griffith & Liyenage, 2008). The blend of informal, personal communication and the mass audience supported by social media is a process for rapid change. An important element of Twitter composition is the hash-tag – a clickable keyword used to categorize tweets. Hash-tags have also spread to other social media platforms – and they’ve even reached everyday speech. Hash-tags have become popular culture, from greetings cards and t-shirts to the dialogue of sitcom characters. Motivation for learning is an important ingredient. “Value- the word which tells us how important you are in this world and must have a faith on you, which would give you an optimistic thought to make yourself like others” (Manigandan K, 2018).
