The aim of the study was found that the social intelligence level of high school students. Simple random sampling was used for the selection of the sample. The researcher adopts the survey method for this research. It was showed that the level of social intelligence is moderate among high school students.

Objectives:

- 2. To examine whether is any significant difference between boys and girls high school students with regard to their social intelligence
- 3. To investigate whether is any significant difference between rural and urban high school students with regard to their social intelligence.

Null Hypotheses:

On the basis of the objectives of the study the researcher formulated the following null hypotheses:

- 1. There would not be any significant difference in the level of social Intelligence of boys and girls high school students.
- 2. There would not be any significant difference in the level of social Intelligence of the high school students belonging to rural and urban area.

Procedure:

In the present study the data was collected by using normative survey method to study the level of social intelligence of high school students

Population:

The researcher selected high school students in Chennai revenue district as the population for the present study.

Sample:

150 high school students were selected in Chennai revenue district.

Research instrument:

The researcher used self made tool of social intelligence scale prepared by Kanimozhi T and Dr. Vasimalairaja in 2019. The tool had 30 items to evaluate social intelligence of high school students

STATISTICAL TECHNIQUES APPLIED:

The collected data was analyzed by using appropriate statistical techniques. Mean, S.D and t- test was used to find out the significant difference of high school students towards social intelligence

FINDINGS

• Social Intelligence level of High School Students is moderate.



- The boys and girls high school students do not differ in their pro social attitude and Empathy
- The male high school students are better than the female in their Social Understanding as the social understanding Mean score (42.6) of male is greater than the mean score (39.4) of female high school students.
- The rural and urban high school students do not differ in their pro social attitude, Empathy and Social Understanding.

INTERPRETATION:

- The 't' test result shows that boys have greater social intelligence than girls. Obviously when compared to girls, boys are visiting many places inside and outside of the school campus individually or with friends or with family members. they are having many opportunity to mingle with many peoples in the society
- The 't' test result shows that the rural and urban high school students do not differ in their social intelligence, because they are having equal opportunity to mingle with many different people in and outside of their house and also they are having equal opportunity to understand the current situation of the society (eg. through mobile phones and mass media)

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Using latest technology and methods of teaching learning processes in the classroom (i.e. seminar, group discussions, club activities, group projects etc.) may improve their social intelligence.
- 2. Conducting Co- Curricular and extracurricular activities in the school may improve their Social intelligence.

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
